ASSESSORS' CONFERENCE

The Thirty-ninth Annual New Jersey Assessors Continuing Education Program at Rutgers began with applause of approval and then shouts of displeasure as opening remarks were made by representatives of the New Jersey Division of Taxation. The four representatives were introduced and welcomed by Joe Gallagher, AMANJ President.

Leslie Thompson, Director, Division of Taxation, spoke to the attendees about her goals for Property Administration. Much of the speech cen-

tered around the personnel cutbacks and the need for Property Administration to define major areas in which their assistance was needed. She discussed modification to Chapter 75, Mod IV system support, reassessment and revaluation criteria and accountability. Thompson also urged assessors to "...be proactive and make sure your voice as an organization is heard."

Accountability within Property Administration has led to a more defined chain of command. The Assistant Director of Property Administration, Steve Sylvester, reiterated the Director's concerns about a limited staff trying to accomplish too many tasks. Striving to improve communication between Assessors and Property Administration is also a goal and a monthly workshop involving the AMANJ Executive Committee was suggested. Sylvester hoped that "good communication will help us accomplish all we wish to accomplish in the future."

George Lorbeck, Chief of the Field Assistance Section, also spoke about accountability and goals. The assessor's accountability was the topic Lorbeck chose and he spoke about the assessor's relationship with the County, Property Administration and to the Municipality. Professionalism via recertification, assessment appeals, appraisal manual updates and valuation of moderate income housing, land including wetlands and contaminated land are projects being pursued by his staff.

In the twenty-five years Harris "Butch" Adams has been coming to the Rutgers Conference, he has probably never been the target of such a negative response. Adams spoke on Chapter 75. "Since the enactment of Chapter 75, we have been reacting to it; now we have become somewhat proactive." Changes being considered were discussed and from the crowd's reaction more discussion will take place.

The New Jersey Assessors' Continuing Education Conference is always an occasion when open discussion takes place on current topics affecting the assessing profession. The Division of Taxation speakers provoked discussion that continued throughout the three days at Rutgers.

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
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AMANJ BI-ANNUAL MEETING

N.J. Assessors Continuing Education Conference

The Bi-Annual Meeting of the Association of Municipal Assessors of New Jersey was called to order at 7:20 pm on Wednesday, June 10, 1992, in the all-purpose room, McCormock Residence, Bush Campus, Rutgers University during the N.J. Assessor's Continuing Education Conference, by President Joseph M. Gallagher.

President Gallagher lead the Association in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Bernie Hobbs made a motion, 2nd by Mike Sheridan, that Harold Lieberskind be appointed as the Essex, Morris, Union Tri-County Vice-President, to fill Carmen Mistichelli's unexpired term. Passed.

Roll call was taken by the Secretary, Vicky Mickiewicz, with 34 members of the AMANJ Board of Directors present, and 92 members signing the attendance sheets.

The minutes of the April 9, 1992 Board of Directors Meeting was approved after a motion was made by Bill Birchall, 2nd by Bill Mitchell.

Treasurer's report was given by the Treasurer, William Nikitich.

Bill Nikitich said that he was going to write a letter to the accountant asking him to absorb the late filing fee to the IRS since it was their fault it was late.

Coorespondence: 1. Lou Schick retired as editor of the bulletin. 2. Letter from IAAO announcing that Marcia Zukowski had received her RES designation.

Ken Beck Committee re-appointments of Bill Michell and Mike Barker were confirmed after a motion was made by Mike Sheridan, 2nd by Bill Bailey.

Nomination Committee report was given by Victor Hartsfield. Motion by Mike Sheridan, 2nd by Bill Birchall that the nominating committee's recommendations be accepted. Passed.

Peter Zipp, John Lloys and Ed Rosenblum talked about some of the court cases involving some Assessors as well as Option 25.

It appears that Director Thompson thinks that there is a problem of accountability with the Assessors, County Tax Boards and administrators, and Local Property Bureau. Since there is going to be a meeting of the Director's Advisory Board on July 10, everyone should formulate their concerns regarding accountability by that date and send them to Joe Gallagher, Victor Hartsfield, Ed Rosenblum.

Aftera lengthy discussion, a motion was made by John Murray, 2nd by Joe Ravitz, that Joe Gallagher, Ed Rosenblum and Harry Haushalter meet with the Directors and her staff and the Deputy Attorney General to express our problems and concerns. There were 5 opposed; motion passed by a majority vote.

Assessors Collectors Liaison: Bill Birchall -

Clyde Sherrow made a motion, 2nd by Joe Ravitz, that we support A1390 which would change the requirement to allow a single value on the tax bills. Passed with 2 opposed.'

IAAO: - Victor Hartsfield - Victor made a motion, 2nd by Frank Bucino, that we endorse Chester Henderson for Vice President of the

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IAAO. Passed.

<u>Farmland Committee:</u> Don Kosul - a joint meeting of the AMANJ Farmland Committee and the Green Acres Division of Forestry is planned in the next couple of months to address some mutual concerns: lack of funding; lack of forest personnel to properly implement programs; lack of inspections; having to rely on consulting foresters and the property owners for information; and the general lack of interest in the Legislature.

NRAAO: Ginny Clancy - The 1992 Conference was held in Portland, Maine with over 200 people in attendance. The 1993 Conference will be held at the Farmington Marriott in Hartford, Conn. New Jersey has been asked to consider hosting the 1997 Conference.

Education Committee: Frank Bucino - Courses 1 & 2 are now IAAO Courses and have replaced the RPA courses. There was a successful Professional Practice Course scheduled in the fall, somewhere in the North. Ray Brown will be the instructor for the 301 course.

Membership Committee: Carol Kerr - The County Treasurers were asked not to hold the dues, but to send in the money from their members as soon as the dies are received.

Everyone was asked to pick up their copy of the AMANJ Consitiution and By-laws. All County Presidents were asked to pick up sufficient copies for all their members who are not present.

<u>Bulletin Committee:</u> Brian Vigue - Randy Brokaw is the new editor.

Ken Beck Scholarship Committee: Bill Mitchell - There will be 8 scholarships awarded at the

Awards Dinner on Thursday, June 11. The recipients are: Susan Louise Birchall, Richard Alexander Dzavik. Catherine Ann Gibbs, James J. Gibbs, Joseph C. Henbest, Danielle Keuler, Ronald Allen Rowe, and Rebecca Joy Vigue. Including the 1992 awards, there will have been 42 recipients receiving a grand total of \$26,150.00 since June 1986.






